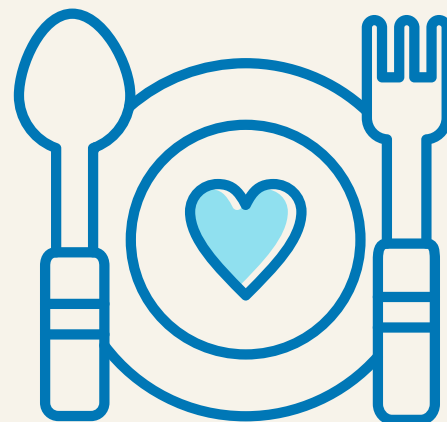

Universal Hot Lunch Program: Utilizing Feeding Futures funding, as well as National School Food Program funding, the Richmond School District will be piloting a *Universal Hot Lunch program* at selected elementary and secondary schools during the months of December and January. This is separate from our PAC Hot Lunch program and is organized at the District level.

Lunch will be offered to all students at Quilchena Elementary School on December 17th (**order deadline Dec 12!**) and January 14th. We will be using the *MunchaLunch* ordering platform to order. Lost & Found: Please take a look to see if any of these items belong to your child(ren). We will be donating any items that have not been collected before the upcoming winter break.



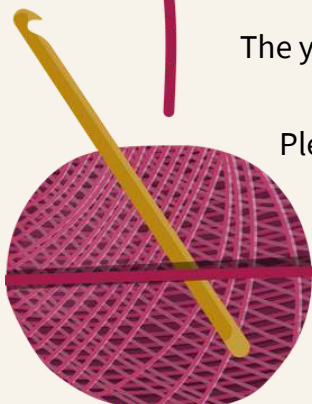
GRADE 7 FAMILIES: TRANSITION TO GRADE 8

VOLUNTEER INTERPRETERS NEEDED

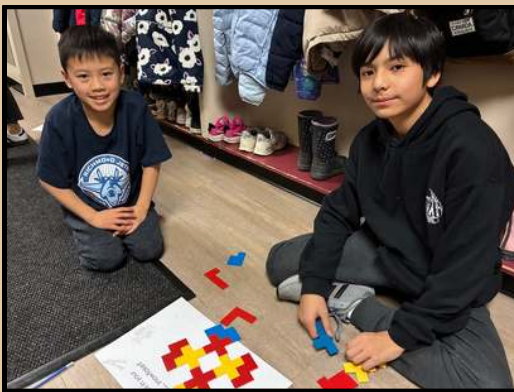
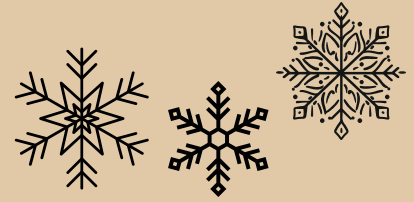
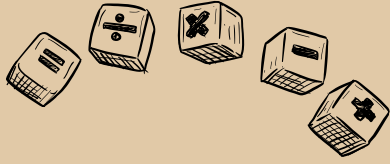
The Richmond School District is seeking individuals who are fluent in English and other languages to join our Volunteer Interpreter Team.
