Yom Kippur: Yom Kippur means "Day of Atonement" in Hebrew. This is the holiest Jewish holiday of the year and ends the ten days of High Holidays or "Days of Awe," which begin with Rosh Hashanah. Traditionally, this is a time where Jewish people refrain from work and all adults fast from sundown the evening before Yom Kippur until nightfall the next day. On the day of Yom Kippur itself, there are many traditional prayers. *Yom Tov* to our Quilchena families who recognize this holiday.

<u>Mawlid al-Nabi</u>: Mawlid al-Nabi is a special day in Islamic calendar to remember the birth of Prophet Muhammad. It is observed on the 12th day of the month of Rabi-ul-Awwal, the third month of the Islamic lunar calendar. Every year, Muslims around the world celebrate the occasion by wearing new clothes, offering prayers, and exchanging gifts. The day is celebrated by preparing special meals at mosques and at home with friends and family. Happy Mawlid al-Nabi to all our Quilchena families who celebrate this special day.



National Day For Truth and Reconciliation: As a school and district, we are dedicated to fostering an inclusive and compassionate environment for all our students, families, and staff. As we approach September 30th, the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, we wanted to share with you a few important events that are taking place in our school and district.

On September 22nd, 2023, our entire district staff will be engaging in a day of learning about Indigenous History, First Peoples Principles of Learning, and our collective role in reconciliation. Please note, this is a Non-Instructional Day and schools will not be in session.

Additionally, in honour of the children lost and the generations impacted by residential schools, we will be displaying the orange "Every Child Matters" flag in our school. We are fortunate to have been gifted this flag through the fundraising efforts of the Student Social Justice Committee at Hugh Boyd Secondary. This student led committee worked hard to raise funds to provide each school in our district with an "Every Child Matters" flag as part of their action towards Truth and Reconciliation. The flag serves as a collective dedication to learning, understanding, healing and reconciliation.

Finally, a reminder that the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation occurs each year on September 30th. As this occurs on Saturday this year, the statutory day will be on Monday, October 2nd, 2023, and therefore school will not be in session on this day. If you have an orange shirt or clothing, please wear it on September 29th to recognize and commemorate the tragic legacy of residential schools, and to honour the thousands of Survivors. Our students have been and will continue to partake in meaningful conversations to better understand the significance of this day in our community and nation.

We continue to be mindful that Covid19 still continues to circulate around the province, and we are trying to reduce the risk of others getting sick.
