<u>The Gift of Giving:</u> Division 7 has been creating Valentine's cards for residents of RainCity Housing, a non-profit organization that provides housing and supports to over 2000 people throughout British Columbia's Lower Mainland and Sunshine Coast. The school transfer window opened on Monday, February 5th and closes Thursday, February 29th. <u>Transfer Request forms</u> must be completed and emailed directly to the school of choice within this timeframe. Transfers are not guaranteed, decisions will be communicated to families on Tuesday, March 5th.

<u>Richmond Education Assistant Program (REAP) Information Session:</u> Do you want to unlock your potential and make a positive impact on the lives of children and youth with diverse abilities? Are you interested in pursuing a career in education? Join the **Richmond Education Assistant Program (REAP)** and obtain your *Education Assistant Graduate Certificate* in six months to one year. Applicants can choose to enroll in our full-time or part-

time program. Our program is designed to provide hands-on training and experience in supporting K-12 students. The majority of REAP graduates find jobs within our district after completion, so this program is the perfect way to start your career in education. Full-Time REAP 2024 will start in July 2024 and end in November 2024. Social Media Family Sessions: Safer Schools Together, in partnership with the Ministry of Education and Childcare, is offering "**Social Media Awareness**" family sessions. These sessions are designed to support families and caregivers as they navigate the digital world. Recommended for Parents/Caregivers/Grandparents and



youth aged 10 and up as a way to facilitate the conversation of safe and caring use of technology at home and in the community. Some of the most prominent concerns currently surrounding use of social media platforms, smartphones, and artificial intelligence will be discussed. <u>Family Peer Support Workers and FamilySmart Monthly Online Events:</u> The Richmond ICY Team and Foundry (Integrated Child & Youth) have five family peer support workers (employed by FamilySmart) ready and available to serve parents and caregivers in Richmond. The family peer support workers can meet with families supporting a child or

youth with a mental health and/or substance youth challenge in person, by video chat, phone, or email. Peer support services are available in Cantonese, English, Mandarin, and Punjabi.
