In Other Quilchena News:



Black Excellence Day: Black Excellence Day started from the movement in early 2021. Black Excellence Day is a day to stand in solidarity with Black Canadians and to learn about the contributions of Black Canadians and their ongoing civil rights struggle. A day to honour the rich history, art, and stories of Black Canadians. The term "Black Excellence" was born out of the civil rights movement in the 1960's and honours great civil rights leader, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. who was born on January 15, 1929.

Raoul Wallenberg Day: On January 17 we remember the selfless bravery of Raoul Wallenberg, a Swedish diplomat who took the initiative to save thousands of persecuted Jews during the Second World War. In 1944, Wallenberg opened a Swedish embassy in Budapest, where 400,000 Jewish men, women and children had already been deported by the Nazis. He began his efforts to protect the Jewish community in Hungary through unconventional methods. It was under the safeguard of the embassy that he provided special protective certificates called Schutz-Passes for 4,000 Jewish people, which granted



them immunity from deportation. On January 17, 1945, Wallenberg was arrested by Soviet forces as they pushed the Nazis out of Hungary. Although his fate remains unknown, his legacy remains. Mr. Wallenberg's heroism is a lesson in humanity, compassion, and courage that inspires us every day to pursue our collective fight against hatred and antisemitism in all their forms.



<u>Written Learning Updates:</u> A reminder that your child's Term 1 Written Learning Update (report card), along with your child's ELL report (if applicable), was published in December on the MyEducation BC Parent Portal. All families received an email from the District regarding instructions on how to access your MyEd account and how to reset your password if it expired.

Glass Art Workshops: Divisions 1-7 will be participating in an inhouse school workshop given by local artist Debbie Hungle. Students will learn about fused glass and create their own art piece. Using coloured glass on a clear base, all kinds of designs are possible. The finished pieces will then be melted in a glass kiln at approximately 1450 degrees Fahrenheit, back in her studio and then will be returned to school for the students to take home. There is a rich beauty in the glass once it comes out of the kiln.





Squid Game: We know as parents, trying to keep up with social media and online streaming shows can be a fulltime job. A second season of Squid Game has started on Netflix and is rated for mature audiences, and we wanted to make sure all our community knows what this show is about if you are not familiar. The series revolves around a contest in which players, drawn from different walks of life play a series of children's games for the chance to win a monetary prize, with a deadly penalty if

they lose. This show has violent and adult content and many of our students have been watching and talking about the show during the school day. Some students are also playing games that mimic the show at recess and lunch, which at school we do not support. We know as guardians and parents; you make the decision in the content your children watch but we encourage you to have open discussions with your children of what behaviours are appropriate when at school and in the community. Kindergarten 2025: Priority 1 Kindergarten (children born in 2020) Registration will close on January 17th, 2025. Every year there are families who miss out on this registration period resulting in their child not being able to attend their catchment school or being placed on a waitlist, both of which cause undue stress to parents and guardians and are completely avoidable. Families are strongly encouraged to register during the Priority 1 registration period for the best chance at attending their

District Program Options Applications for September 2025/26: Applications for Early French Immersion

(entering Kindergarten or Grade 1), Late French Immersion (entering Grade 6) and Montessori (entering Kindergarten to Grade 4) are being accepted online. Parents must have their child's registration ID number (new students) or Pupil Number (current students) in order to apply. The deadline for applications for September 2025/26 is Friday, January 17, 2025. Thinking about Grade 8: The parents/guardians of our Grade 7 students were given a letter indicating their catchment high school (and the parent information evenings they host) earlier this week. Please contact Mrs. Hughes if you did not receive this information. If you are considering submitting a Transfer Request, the form will be available on our school website under Parents>Resources>School Forms in late January. Completed forms are to be *emailed directly to the chosen high school* between February 3-28. Students applying for out-of-catchment incentive programs MUST also submit a transfer request.



Voluntary Student Absences: As we begin our second term, we would like to remind families of the importance



of student attendance. We acknowledge that there may be exceptional circumstances that necessitates a student's extended voluntary absence, but it should not be the goal of families to remove their children from school for vacations during instructional time. We have very generous vacation periods throughout the year that can be used for holidays. Missed school not only impacts your child, but also the entire class when group projects and collaboration times are affected. If voluntary absences exceed the allowable amount, your child will be withdrawn, requiring re-registration on your return. We cannot guarantee their placement at Quilchena. If voluntary absences are unavoidable, please

complete the Extended Leave Form <u>HERE</u> and return it to the office at least one week prior to departure. We greatly appreciate your cooperation.

Needing Support: The provincial government has renewed the *Student and Family Affordability Fund*. This fund
