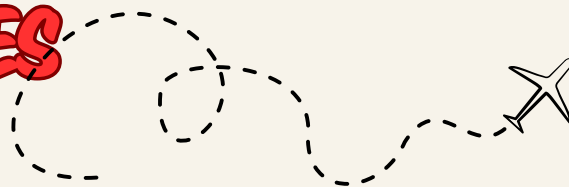

Voluntary Student Absences: As we are close to the end of our first term, we would like to remind families again of the importance of student attendance. We acknowledge that there may be exceptional circumstances that necessitates a student's extended voluntary absence, but it should not be the goal of families to remove their children from school for vacations during instructional time. Missed school not only impacts your child, but also the entire class when group projects and collaboration times are affected. If voluntary absences exceed the allowable amount, your child will be withdrawn from Quilchena, requiring re-registration on your return. As well, teachers will not be providing work packages or homework for students. If voluntary absences are unavoidable, please advise your teacher, as well as complete the Extended Leave Form [HERE](#) and return it to the office at least one week prior to departure. We greatly appreciate your cooperation.

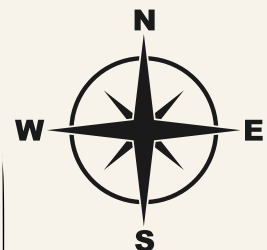
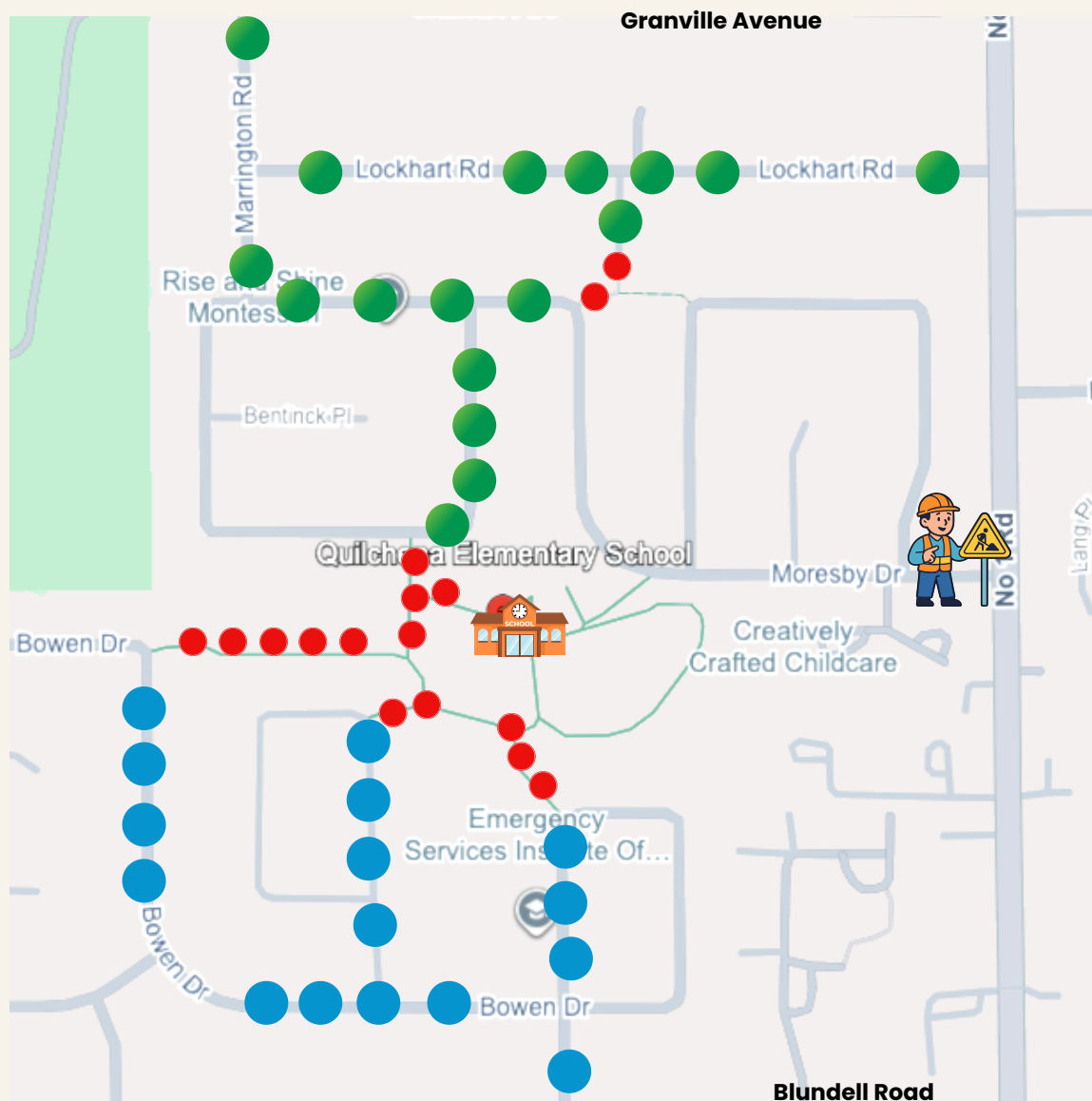
MORESBY DRIVE CONSTRUCTION
