***After School
Supervision***

After school, there is no supervision provided on the playground, and this is a serious safety concern as we have noticed an increasing number of children after school with no adult supervision. If a child is injured during this time, it is not acceptable to assume someone else is responsible. Children who remain on school grounds after dismissal must be actively supervised by a parent or guardian at all times.

We also want to remind families that Miss Jessy—whom many of you know from the Before & After School Childcare program—is employed solely by the families enrolled in her care. She is not available to supervise the playground, intervene in disputes, or monitor children who are not part of her after school program. If your child is staying on the playground after school, it is your responsibility to be present and supervising them. This expectation is non-negotiable and necessary to ensure the safety of all students.

Please note that the school front doors lock at 3:15 PM. In the event of an emergency or unforeseen issue - such as a parent or guardian not arriving at pick up time - children may knock on the school doors and staff will assist them.

*Extended Absences
during
the school year*

We are noticing an increasing number of students being taken out of school for family vacations during instructional time. While we understand that family commitments and travel opportunities can be meaningful, it is important to recognize the significant impact these absences have on student learning.

When students miss school for extended periods (sometimes repeatedly throughout the school year), they miss direct instruction, guided practice, classroom discussions, collaborative learning, and hands-on activities that cannot be replicated through worksheets or make-up assignments. Teachers do their best to support students upon their return, but they are not able to re-teach entire units or recreate the full learning experience that takes place in the classroom.

Beyond the impact on the individual student, extended absences also affect the entire class. Teachers must redirect time and resources to help returning students catch up, adjust group work, and revisit previously taught material. This disrupts the flow of instruction and can slow down learning progress for everyone.

Additionally, because taking students out of school for vacation is a parental choice, it is important to note that *teachers are not obliged to provide homework, work packages, or advance assignments for the missed days*. Families should expect that students will need time and support to re-engage with the learning upon their return.

We kindly ask that families make every effort to schedule vacations during designated school breaks. Regular attendance supports consistency, reduces stress, and helps maintain a strong learning environment for all students.

If voluntary absences are unavoidable, please advise your teacher as soon as possible, as well as complete the Extended Leave Form [HERE](#) and return it to the office at least one week prior to departure.

Stay Informed with SchoolMessenger Text Alerts (Opt-In)



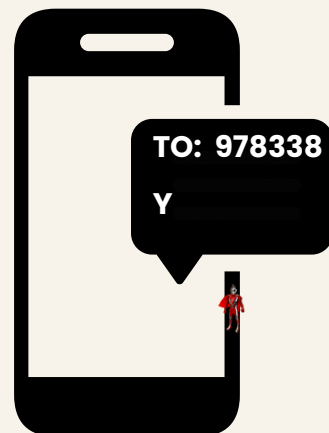
Our District uses SchoolMessenger to share important school and district updates, including weather closures, emergency notifications, reminders, and time-sensitive announcements.

All families with a current cell phone number in our MyEd student database will receive a text message from SchoolMessenger in February.
To start receiving text alerts, you will need to opt-in.

How to opt-in:

1. Watch for a text from SchoolMessenger (Text #: 978338).
2. Reply with "Y" to 978338.
3. You will receive a confirmation message letting you know you're successfully subscribed.

Want alerts on more than one device? To receive text alerts on multiple phones, each phone number must opt in separately by replying "Y" to 978338.



Parent Volunteer Driver Requirements – Updated Procedure

Parents who would like to volunteer to drive students to school field trips and/or team events, are asked to follow our updated procedure:

- Driver Authorization Form: Must be completed before driving for any school event. Must be completed every school year.
- Criminal Record Check: A quick 5-minute free online criminal record check is required. We will provide the link and the school district code necessary to submit. CRC's are valid for two years. This requirement applies regardless of whether you currently hold a criminal record check or have completed one in the past.
- Vehicle Insurance: Drivers must have a \$1 million minimum of liability coverage. A copy of your insurance must be submitted to the school office.
- You can locate these forms on our school website under the Parents tab>School Resources>School Forms

If you have already completed a Driver Authorization Form this school year, you do not need to submit another form, however if you volunteer to drive again this year a CRC is required, as well as proof of vehicle insurance. If you are unsure whether you have completed a Driver form yet this year, please contact the school office.
